According to the US Department of Energy (DOE) EV-Pro Lite calculator, in order to support a target of 41,000 light-duty EVs by 2025, Maine would need to install 3,111 L2 charging plugs at workplaces, 209 publicly accessible charging plugs and 303 DCFC (L3).
